Brief History

Joining Westfields Sports and WAC early in 2001 Christie didn't waste time in rising to the top of NSW by winning State titles at the NSW CHS and NSW All Schools Championships in Shot put. In her early years with us the Shot put was her preferred event. Always having been coached by Denis Knowles she was in a unique position of having the best training partner in the country and possibly the World. Born one year after Dani Samuels, Christie would literally be following in the footsteps of Australia's greatest ever thrower and receiving coaching from one of the World's best as well in Denis.

By year 8 Christie had won her first National medal – a Bronze in the Shot put and an impressive 4^{th} placing in Discus at the 2002 Australian All Schools. However more impressively in her pet event the Shot Put Christie would win the Gold medal at NSW CHS in every age group (12 – 17+) even though when she and Dani would contest the same year together as 17+ she was relegated to Silver and then upon Dani's graduation Christie would win back the title in her Pathways year.

2006 Christie Was selected for the World Schools Games in Greece and ironically she and fellow WAC athlete Dale Jenner would finish in 4th place in their events. Christie was just centimetres from Bronze in the Discus and finished 6th in the Shot put. It was her first taste of International competition, her first Australian uniform and would set the scene for her future career.

Christies first Australian Open in 2007 in Brisbane saw brilliant performances in both events. With one round to go in the Shot Put, Christie was in 3rd place and poised to take her first National Open medal. As luck would have it Christie did not improve on her 6th attempt and she was passed by 3 other competitors and relegated into 6th position. Christie also finished in 9th place in Discus with a creditable 44.97m. It would also be that final year at school (2007) that Christie began emerging as an exceptionally talented discus thrower when winning the NSW CHS Discus Gold medal she threw over the World Junior standard of 47.00 metres (47.20). Then one month later Christie improved her P.B. to 49.41 metres to take out the NSW All Schools title. This incredible performance gave Christie a top 10 World junior ranking. Unfortunately Christie would not make the final cut off for selection in the next year, however it set the platform for what would become a brilliant career in Discus with the Shot put moving into the background in importance.

2008 brought more success when Christie was asked to participate in the Beijing Good Neighbour tournament which served as the test event in the "Bird's nest" for the 2008 Beijing Olympics. Alongside training partner Dani Samuels, she performed well in the new stadium. Then within days she was invited to compete in an International Grand Prix event in Taiwan where she won Silver and Bronze medals in Discus and Shot put respectively.

2009 was a sad year for Westfields when Roger Green (Westfields throw coach) passed away. Christie was asked to take over the coaching role as Westfields second throwing coach. Christie would successfully fit into the role and now became an "athletics-triple –threat" with her working career in Child-care, training as an elite athlete and working twice weekly as a coach.

Injuries would take their toll until 2010 when Christie picked up her first Australian Open medal – a bronze medal in Discus; but more Importantly a magnificent p.b. breaking the 50 metre barrier with 51.13 metres. Interestingly Christie formed part of WAC's greatest ever Australian Open Championships with Fabrice Lapierre delivering the Worlds 7th longest ever leap 8.78m, Hayley Butler winning the hurdles in a Commonwealth Games 'A' qualifying time of 13.25, Daniel Small 'B' Comm. Games qualifier of 13.88 in the 110m hurdles (Silver), Dani Samuels Gold in Discus 'A' qualifier, Matt Outzen Silver in Javelin 'B' qualifier and Kurt Jenner 6th in Long jump. We had won 6 Australian Open medals!

Things quietened down for several years with more injuries and then during the 2013-2014 season Christie would be at her best throwing p.b.'s in both Discus and Shot put. She gained her first Australian senior uniform in 2013 and competed at the Oceania Games winning the Gold medal in Discus. Then it all came together at the Adelaide Track Classic in 2014 where she threw 56.79m. This throw gained her Commonwealth Games selection and elevated her to number 13 on the Australian All-time lists. For the first time she also medalled in both events at the Australian Open and was named in the 2014 Australian Team for the Glasgow Commonwealth Games. Christie was successful in the qualifying rounds and finished a creditable 11th in the final. Christie became only the 4th WAC athlete ever to compete at a Commonwealth Games.

Interesting facts:

- Only 12 Australians in history have ever thrown the discus further than Christie's 56.79m personal best.
- Dani Samuels, Fabrice Lapierre, John Thornell and Christie are the only WAC athletes ever to compete at a Commonwealth Games.
- Only Dani Samuels, Scott Winters (110m hurdles 1981-1987) and Christie have ever won NSW CHS titles in every age group 12 years to 17 years+ for Westfields in the same event.
- NSW CHS Blues (the highest honour in Sport) have only been won by John Thornell, Joven Clarke, Scott Burriss, Matt Outzen, Dale Jenner, Dani Samuels, Stephanie Langridge, Kyle Alexis and Christie in the history of Westfields.
- Even though Christie was World ranked in the top 10 for the 2014 World Juniors, because she finished 3rd at the Australian Junior's (World Junior Selection Trials) she missed selection. (!AAF only allow 2 per event)
