

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

TELL THEM FROM ME SURVEY – YEARS 7-11

This term, your school is taking part in the Tell Them From Me student survey. PARENT ONLINE PAYMENTS NOW AVAILABLE

It is now possible for parents to make online payments to the school for amounts owing for students, via a secure payment page hosted by Westpac. Payments can be made using either a Visa or MasterCard credit or debit card, <u>and can be made via computer</u>, <u>tablet or</u> <u>mobile phone</u>. The payment page is accessed from the front page of the school's website by selecting <u>\$ Make a</u> <u>payment</u>.

At this stage we would only like parents to pay for their child's school fees. Excursions must be paid by the student at school.

When you access the <u>\$ Make a payment</u> you must enter:

- The students name, and
- Class and reference number OR
- The students name, and
- Date of birth.

This is a secure payment system hosted by Westpac to ensure that your credit/debit card details are captured in a secure manner; these details are not passed back to the school.

You have the ability to check and change any details of the payment before it is processed. Receipts can be emailed and/or printed.

Details of the payments are passed daily to the school where they will be receipted against your child's account. As a receipt has been issued from the payment page a further receipt will not be issued by the school.

SHIN SPLINTS

Ache and pain in your shins after doing excessive running, jumping or walking can be an indicator of shin splints. This is the time of year that people come in complaining of shin pain as they start to train on hard summer baked grounds. Shin splint pain can be caused by injury to the surrounding muscles, tenoperiosteum (where the tendon attaches to the bone) and in severe cases the bone itself.

Contributing factors:

- Flat feet ٠
- Movement issues with running, walking or jumping
- Stiff ankles
- Weak muscles in the calf, upper thigh and buttocks
- Sudden increase in training intensity or frequency (especially as the season begins)
- Recent change in footwear or wearing shoes with poor arch support

How can we help:

- Assess your movement of your joints to ensure they are moving efficiently and have adequate length
- Tape to unload tight structures
- Massage and release tight muscles
- Create a strengthening and flexibility program
- Create a return to sport program •


