Year 7 Students are all being offered an enriching day at Sydney University in early November organised by Ms Awad. Year 9 have an inquiry Science and Maths day coming up soon to experience Sydney University facilities and future course and career options with Mr Azzopardi. Year 10 have completed the last of their Compass Sydney University study skills program and were engaged and involved right up to the end. The Homework centre has benefited from Compass University students tuition for reading and mathematics on a regular basis throughout the year. YEAR 11 CROSSROADS

Last week Year 11 students completed the 'Crossroads' course, which is a mandatory course for all senior government high school students. The four-day program involved a variety of workshops with visiting speakers who dealt with issues relating to the key topics of 'Drugs', 'Relationships', 'Driver Education' and 'Money Matters'

Visiting speakers and presentations were given by:

- Family drug support representatives using a very powerful and heartfelt visual presentation to stress how easily a person could become addicted to drugs and the tragic effects on family and friends.
- 'Youth Safe' representatives using 'safe partying' and 'driver safety' as themes for discussion and information.
- Bonnyrigg Fire Service and Police School Liaison Officers gave strong messages about safe driving and legal matters.
