

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

With one more week until Westfields Sports rolls over to the 2014 timetable, all students are advised to ensure that they have their new timetable ready for commencement on 25 November and that all clearance forms are completed. Teachers will advise students of any new equipment necessary – when they meet their new classes. Year 11 students have already commenced assessment tasks, which will be included in their HSC mark. To assist senior classes, the latest assessment booklets have been emailed and it is essential that seniors copy this document and plot all assessment details for the next twelve months.

On Monday evening, at 6.00pm in the stadium, an essential HSC Information meeting has been planned by Ms Jethi. This will include a speaker from the Board of Studies giving advice and rules for successful completion of the HSC. In addition, students will gain valuable details from our careers adviser, Mr Blevin – on career pathways, university requirements and TAFE options. A hard copy of assessment schedules will also be issued at this meeting.

Current Year 9 students will experience significant changes to their routine at rollover. As Year 10 students, they will commence their school day at 8.20am and conclude classes at 1.15pm on each of Monday, Thursday and Friday. Students will finish their school days at 3.06pm on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. In addition, all Year 10 students will wear the senior "blue" shirt.

Our Homework Centre will continue operating on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays until the end of term. Saturday school classes will conclude on Saturday 7 December, 2013.


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YEAR 7 COMPASS EXCURSION
