FROM THE PRINCIPAL

As the year comes to an end, I thought that I would take the opportunity to recap on some of the main highlights in what has been another hugely successful year for Westfields Sports. As there are no longer any School Certificate exams and our HSC results do not arrive until next week, the only other external exams were NAPLAN for Years 7 and 9. The single most important aspect of these exams is our ability to track individual student performance over that two-year period. I am pleased to say that the growth data for our current Year 9 students from when they sat their NAPLAN tests in Year 7 in 2011 was above state average.

Our Recognition Of Student Excellence Awards and morning teas celebrated and rewarded academic success and were once again well supported by parents. As in previous years, we had many students who received distinction and high distinction awards in Australia wide competitions in English, Maths and Science. Our debating teams were also highly successful.

In terms of our sporting achievements, this year we had 18 students selected to represent Australia and 72 selected to represent NSW in their chosen sports. Westfields won 7 state knockout competitions. 5 students received SSW sporting blues as well as the prestigious President's Award and 5 Westfields students received a NSWCHS Sporting Blue.

The outstanding performance from our creative and performing arts students was winning the Sydney Eisteddfod and being invited to the Champion of Champions. In addition to our drama and music nights, our students performed at the Evening of Dance at the Casula Powerhouse, regional and state dance and more recently at school spectacular. As an indication of the success of our dance program 11 individual dance items from this year's HSC cohort have been selected to perform at HSC Dance Call Back, which places us right at the top of the state.

We have continued to improve our facilities and resources and work has recently commenced on the complete refurbishment of our E Block science laboratories. This term we have been functioning with only three science labs, however, I am sure that all will be forgotten when we take possession of the fully refurbished labs on day one next year.

In terms of technology, all students in our current Years 10, 11 and 12 have their own laptop but unfortunately the program is no longer being funded. To overcome this problem next year we will be undertaking a trial with some of the latest Ipad and tablet technology to determine how to implement the most effective BYOD program in to our school. We believe it is important that your sons and daughters have access to the latest technology to help them prepare for digital and online needs of our 21st century society. To this end, every classroom in the school now has either a fixed data projector, an interactive data projector or an interactive whiteboard. With the hot weather now upon us, I am pleased to let you know that this year we have also continued our air conditioning program.

As this is the final Westnews for 2013, I would like to publicly acknowledge the hard working and committed teaching and administration staff and coaches who have helped your sons and daughters to achieve their wonderful successes. A special vote of thanks needs to go to the hard working P & C who continue to support and fundraise for our school.

I would also like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a safe, happy and relaxing Christmas break and look forward to an even bigger and better year to come. A reminder that Years 7,11 and 12 return on Wednesday 29 January and Years 8, 9 and 10 return on Thursday 30 January 2014.

A number of scholarships or awards were presented to students who had successfully presented an application or been identified by staff. These included The Crosio, Evans and Caulfield scholarships – valued at \$1100 and presented to V Mo, A Kotevski, M Khouth and C Tembeleski. Our Vocational Education students, *S Luc and H Truong* were recognised for their outstanding achievement.

The dux of this year's HSC class, *V Luu*, was recognised by the University of NSW with their Academic Achievement Award. Smithfield RSL presented *J Ly* with \$1500 for his all-round performance in Year 12.

It was a pleasure to recognise all of the above named students for their efforts. In addition, four senior students were acknowledged for their sustained school service in ensuring that our last four years of formal awards ceremonies have run exceptionally well: *Jasmine, Rowena, Linda and Vivian*.

students. Mr Azzopardi offered his year group a "High Resolves" leadership program. Mrs Kenny has overseen numerous sporting events along with coaching staff. Our Chaplain, Tony Hoang provided an opportunity for students to attend Knox Grammar for a special "Stand Tall" event which had a focus on safe behaviours. Peter Rose from MTC and Mr Hales ran a very successful program for our Refugee students. Many faculty-based excursions gave great insights into areas of study.
