FROM THE RELIEVING PRINCIPAL

I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate our Dance program on an outstanding Evening of Dance on Friday 28 October. On Monday 31 October Westfields Sports held its annual Sportsperson of the Year Awards. This is the pinnacle of sporting recognition at this school. We were honoured to have Australian Netball Diamond and former student Kristiana Manu'a return to speak to the students. Her message of drive and determination resonated with all present. The Sportsperson of the Year was awarded to Blake Jackson from the Softball Program. Blake has been a strong leader within the program and has achieved selection in the Australian U19 Men's team that recently played in the US. His overall attitude and commitment make him a most worthy recipient of this award. The list of Blues recipients for this year reflected the enormous depth of talent at this school and the dedication of coaches and parents to allow students to achieve their potential

Westfields Sports has highly dedicated first aid officers who are trained to deal with emergencies and injuries to students in the course of their daily activities at school. The local shopping centre provides the community with a valuable service, but causes the school no end of headaches. Students congregate in the area of a morning and afternoon and, unfortunately, sometimes engage in anti-social activities. Please support the school by directing your children to avoid the local shops and to come directly into school in the morning.

Student Opal Cards entitle students to free transport to and from school. Drivers have been instructed by the Ministry of Transport to only allow students to use Opal Cards from designated school bus stops. The stops for our school are either in the bus bay or directly outside the school on Hamilton Road. Student Opal Cards will also be 'deactivated' for the period of the school holidays. Students will need to keep their cards for 2017.

For parents new to Westfields Sports we will be beginning the 2017 timetable on Monday 21 November. This is called 'Rollover' and provides students an opportunity to settle into new classes and to 'hit the ground running' in the new year. Students will need new books for rollover.

This week Westfields Sports said farewell to one of its longest serving coaches. Fred O'Connor coached athletics for 25 years at Westfields Sports and in that time coached Olympians, World, National and State champions and left everyone who met him a better person for the experience. Fred was an Olympic standard athlete himself who simply wasn't able to afford the money to go to the 1948 Olympics (athletes had to pay their own way!). He served his country in WW2, won a first grade Rugby League premiership with Newtown, played first grade in Cricket, Soccer, Basketball and AFL and ran 10 seconds for the 110 yard (100m) sprint! An amazing man by any standard and one that has made Westfields Sports a better place for his presence. I wish Fred all the best for the future.

HOMEWORK CENTRE

Supporting Student Learning Beyond the Classroom

Westfields Sports Homework Centre operates three afternoons a week in the school Library. The Homework Centre runs Tuesday, Wednesday Thursday from 3:06pm to 4:15pm.

Experienced teachers who can assist students with their homework and school assignments operate the Homework Centre. Homework is seen as a vital part of learning and students can expect to have either assignments or homework in each of their subjects.

Homework refers to tasks assigned to students by their teachers to be completed outside of the classroom. Common homework assignments may include a quantity or period of reading, writing, problems to be solved, a school project to be built or other skills to be practiced.

Policies & Procedures

The Homework Centre is especially beneficial to those students looking for a quiet place to concentrate on their learning outside of their home or to those seeking help with a particular homework problem of their assignments.

Students are required to sign in to the Homework Centre before entering the Library and will be supervised until 4.15pm, then will be escorted off school premises by one of the supervising teachers. Students are also required to maintain school rules and expectations, work quietly and use the library resources respectfully and appropriately.
