FROM THE PRINCIPAL

I have just returned to the Principal's chair after five weeks of leave and would like to take this opportunity to publicly thank Andrew Rogers for doing such an admirable job. It is good to know that the school continues to run effectively and efficiently in my absence.

On Wednesday morning I had the privilege of joining the CEO of Cricket NSW, Andrew Jones, to jointly launch the partnership between the NSW Sports High Schools and Cricket NSW. The highlight of the day was the announcement that Westfields has been fully endorsed as the first "High Performance" cricket school in NSW. In addition, Cricket NSW has promised to assist us with an upgrade of our cricket nets, which is wonderful news for our cricket program.

On Thursday we had the site meeting for the extensions to our strength and conditioning facility. Work is scheduled to commence next Tuesday and should be completed for the first day back at school next year. Of course we will need to purchase additional equipment to fill this new area so we will be in contact early next year with details of a tax deductible donation program to help us to outfit the new weights training area.

By the time you read this newsletter, we will have commenced our annual rollover to the 2017 timetable, which means that all students are promoted to next year's classes. This is done to ensure that meaningful work continues right up until the last day. This will have a significant impact on Year 9 students as they become Year 10 and therefore join the senior school. As seniors, Year 10 will commence classes at 8.20 am each day and on Monday, Thursday and Friday, complete their school day at 1.15 pm. If your son or daughter has not done so already, they must return all outstanding textbooks and school resources and pay any outstanding fees and charges prior to complete the roll over process.

Our final P&C meeting is on Wednesday 23 November. As it is the last meeting for the year we hold our Christmas Function at Canley Heights RSL commencing at 6.30 pm.

The coming few weeks are a very busy time for our school. Following are some important dates for your diary - Tuesday 6 December is Year 7 Orientation Night and Tuesday 13 December our Annual Academic Presentation Night at Club Marconi. Our Year 12 students receive their HSC results on Thursday 15 December and their university ATAR results on Friday 16 December. We will be holding a morning tea for Year 12 at 10.00 am on Friday 16 to enable them to come back to school one last time to share their results with staff.
