

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

We were extremely fortunate to have two of our most famous former students; Michael and Kyly Clarke visit our school on Tuesday. They both spoke really positively about their time at Westfields and reinforced a couple of key messages that I hope the students took on board. The first was that it is a waste of time trying to compare yourself to others. The important thing is to concentrate on being the best that you can be. Both Michael and Kyly emphasised the importance of setting goals and then having the determination and desire to follow through to achieve those goals. Term 2 is a vital term for all students in relation to their studies. I expect that students in Years 7 and 8 would be spending 60 minutes completing study and homework every night. Students in Years 9 and 10, 90 minutes and students in Years 11 and 12, 2-3 hours per night. Year 12 students only have six school weeks until their Trial HSC and they should have already commenced their study for these important exams.

Our Year 11 and 12 Parent Teacher Night is on Tuesday 7 June. All bookings for this event are online. A letter, which contains instructions and also your families code required to access the online bookings will be sent home in the next few days. We will also be sending a reminder SMS message in the week prior to Parent Teacher night.

I am sure that you are aware that our Talented Sports Program runs without any financial assistance from either the Government or the Department of Education. In fact, we rely heavily on sponsorship and donations to run our sports programs. As I mentioned in previous editions of Westnews, we have a fund set up with the Australian Sports Foundation (ASF) which enables parents or community members to make tax deductable donations. Our project is registered with the ASF to purchase equipment for our weights room which enables all donations of \$2.00 and over to be tax deductible. ITALY / SPAIN CULTURAL TOUR

The Italy/Spain Cultural Tour wasn't your ordinary excursion. For two weeks, 26 students travelled to Europe to explore and indulge in the amazing culture of both Italy and Spain. We learnt by being present at the most famous points of history. We broadened our horizons and allowed for new experience, which has definitely been empowering and memorable. Starting our European expedition, we left Sydney Airport and arrived in Spain 24 hours later. During our stay in Spain, we stayed in the two major capitals, Barcelona and Madrid. In Barcelona we travelled around the city, learning about the great Spanish Architect Gaudi and his intrinsic and symbolic designs. The most extravagant building of his conception was the "La Sagrada Familia", a famous Spanish church that is still undergoing construction to this very day. We had the opportunity to visit the iconic sporting centres of Barcelona, including the FC Barcelona Stadium and the Barcelona Olympic Grounds. We then progressed to Madrid by bullet train and watched an authentic Flamenco dance as exposure to the Spanish 'night life'. Madrid is home to many political and artistic establishments, as well as the home ground to Real Madrid FC. Being in Spain has opened our perceptions to different conventions across the world. As a group we were cognisant of the big differences between Australian and European culture, and were eager to learn more as we prepared for our descent into Italy.

Arriving in Milan we passed through Verona, home of the iconic Romeo and Juliet balcony where we also indulged in our very first Italian gelato, to which nothing would compare. By boat, we entered Venice, a stunning city surrounded by water, connected by hundreds of bridges. We visited the main square of Venice that contained an abundance of pigeons, which would sooner or later be consumed by residents and tourists. During our stay in Venice, we had the luxury of participating in a gondola ride and bear witness to the beauty of Venice. Florence was the next stop on our route across Italy. There we saw one of the most Iconic figures in Italian art, "The Statue of David" along with traditional places of worship. The trip concluded with Rome, where we packed as much sightseeing as possible. While in Rome, we dedicated a day to Pompeii and revelled in the strong history that has been excavated through the years. The remainder of the trip focused on the most famous landmarks that define Italy, The Colosseum, The Pantheon, The Trevi Fountain and the Spanish Steps. We ended the trip with a evening visit of the Colosseum which was a perfect ending to the trip.



For all that attended, we have gained so much knowledge of the greater world and are appreciative to have been given this opportunity to travel at a young age with people who have become great friends. On behalf of all students and parents, we would like to acknowledge and praise the efforts of Ms Ayas, Mrs Zappia, Mr Martin and Ms Avery for their impeccable organisation and their dedication to ensuring our safety, as well as ensuring that all had a good time. Breaking News: *Hayden Kovacic* has just represented Westfields at the Olympic Test event in the Olympic Stadium in Rio de Janeiro. He won his heat of the 100m in a new PB of 10.36, came fourth in the semi-final with another PB of 10.35 and finished eigth in the final. His first International competition ever !!

On the same night half way across the World in Beijing at the first Diamond League Grand Prix of the year also competing for Westfields were our two World Champions Dani Samuels and Fabrice Lapierre. Dani finished 2nd against the strongest possible opposition (every contender for the Olympic medals in Rio were in her event). She threw a brilliant 67.77m, which is her second best throw ever. Fabrice also finished 3rd with a jump of 8.09m, although his season best is 8.25m.
