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NERVE PAIN INTO ARMS:

Zing! Have you ever felt that sharp pain and/or electric shock into the arm and fingers which leaves you wondering what is happening? This may be a nerve being pinched or compressed at your neck. Things like poor slouched postures, getting tackled awkwardly in Rugby or just sleeping in the wrong position, could be the cause of this nerve compression.

What are the symptoms?

- Pain/discomfort/Pins and needles/Numbness which extends from the neck and often down into the hand/fingers
- Often weakness may be noted into the arm, hand, and difficulty gripping may also be present

What can you do about it?

- Neck exercises which take the pressure off the nerve
- Mobilization/massage to release tight muscles
- Postural correction
- Taping
- Rest and activity modification
