I began my teaching career in 1980 at Hillston Central School followed by stints at Seven Hills High School and Corowa High, was Head Teacher at Castle Hill High School and Deputy Principal at Greystanes High School. I was appointed as Principal at Westfields Sports at the beginning of 2007, meaning this is my twelfth year at this school. I have been really proud to be the Principal of this outstanding school and it has been a privilege to be able to lead such a wonderfully committed staff. Every year Westfields produces about 20 Australian and 100 state sports representatives and we win around 15 state and Australian sports knockout competitions. We also excel academically. Each year one or more students achieve an ATAR of 99, about 60% of our Year 12 students go to university and our value added result from Year 9 NAPLAN to the HSC places us in the top 3 percent of all schools from around the state. How could I not be proud to lead a school that achieves such remarkable results.

People who really care about the students and who are driven to providing the best learning outcomes for every single student. I would like to take this opportunity to personally thank those people who have been there to help, support and mentor me throughout this journey.

To the teaching, administration and coaching staff, I thank you for being dedicated professionals who have always put the students first. To the executive staff I thank you for your commitment and support. You are an exceptional group of leaders and it has been wonderful to work with you over the past 12 years.

I would like to single out the Senior Executive at Westfields for special mention. Individually they are wonderful mentors and leaders but collectively they are the driving force behind the continued success of Westfields Sports. We are without doubt the most complex public school in the state and their ability to ensure that the school not only functions efficiently and effectively but continues to be a the leading edge of change is unsurpassed.

Finally, to the parents, thank you for your ongoing support, not only of your sons and daughters but also of Westfields Sports. This strong home school partnership has been essential in assisting every student to reach their potential.

It has been a privilege to know you all and I will forever have wonderful memories of my time at Westfields Sports. I know that Westfields will continue to be the number one sports high school in Australia. Thank you all once again and best wishes for the future.

ANKLE SPRAINS: THE CULPRIT TO POOR PERFORMANCE AND INCREASED RISK OF INJURY.

Ankle sprains, even the small sprains can be the reason you keep getting injured or aren't able to perform at your best. Ankle sprains are common amongst the sporting community and often small sprains occur in day to day training and games which don't often ring the alarm bells for the player. However, even small sprains can cause a change in the way we move.

Ankle sprains can lead to reduced proprioception/balance, increased stiffness in the ankle joint and increased loosening of the ankle ligaments. Not only are there local changes around the ankle but there may be whole body disruption to your normal movement patterns, this is often seen when testing single leg balance on the injured side

If you have had a recent ankle sprain or have recurrent ankle sprains throughout the season, then it may be time to get a review. We conduct a full mechanical screening test which includes a balance test to determine if there are any changes to your movement patterns which may cause an increased rate of injuries or performance issues.
